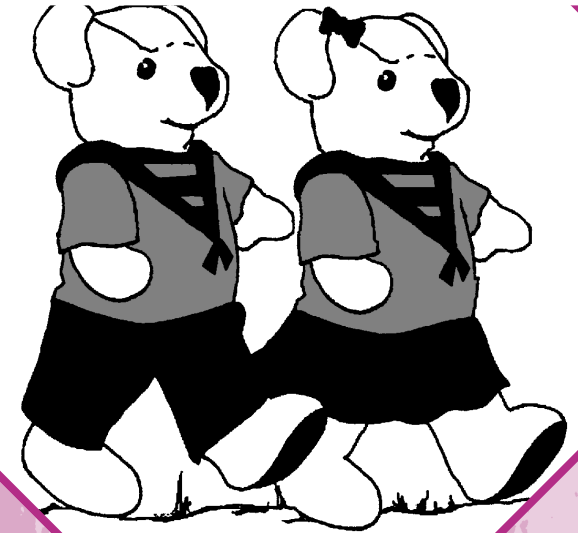

## 6. THE LOOK OUT

There is a large Discovery Play Trail at The Look Out suitable for children of all ages. The site also includes a picnic area, gift shop, coffee shop, tourist information centre and plenty of free car parking. For more information call 01344 354400.

**How to get there:** The Look Out Discovery Centre is on Nine Mile Ride (B3430) south of Bracknell town centre. The site is well signposted.

## 7. CHAUCER WOODS

The site has a tree-fringed lake and peaceful woodland paths as well as an equipped play area. Seats enable you to relax and enjoy the view and swans can often be seen gliding on the water.

**How to get there:** South of Crowthorne town centre turn into Byron Road and head towards the entrance to Wellington College. Turn right into Chaucer Road, then left into Fielding Gardens. The entrance to Chaucer Woods is facing you.

## 8. AMBARROW COURT

The site includes a mixture of attractive woodland trails and open spaces. Some stretches are suitable for pushchairs. There is also a picnic area with tables and benches, a pretty meadow and a butterfly garden.

**How to get there:** The main entrance to Ambarrow Court is on the A321 Lower Wokingham Road at Little Sandhurst.

## 9. SNAPRAILS PARK

Snaprails Park is an attractive wooded site south of Crowthorne, between Sandhurst and College Town. From the main entrance on Wellington Road an attractive wide path, suitable for pushchairs, leads through the trees to a grassy open space where there is an enclosed children's play area. You can relax by the tree-lined pond and stream or follow a pleasant woodland path along the edge of the park.

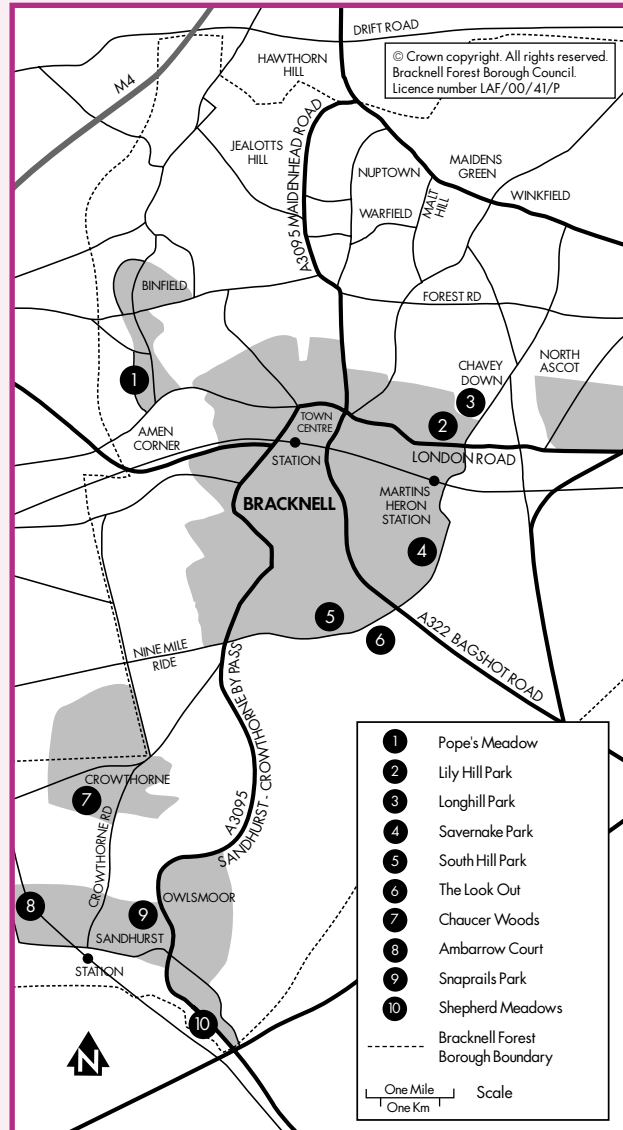
**How to get there:** The main entrance to Snaprails Park is off Wellington Road, which links Little Sandhurst with the A321 Yorktown Road.

## 10. SHEPHERD MEADOWS

Shepherd Meadows covers 100 acres of wildflower meadow and woodland straddling the River Blackwater. The site includes a picnic area and a playing field, both of which are just a few yards from the car park.

**How to get there:** The main entrance to Shepherd Meadows is off the A321 (Marshall Road) between Sandhurst and Camberley.

# EDDY TRAILS

## INTRODUCTION

Have you ever set off for a breath of fresh air with your family only to go home frustrated by wet and muddy paths, bumpy and uneven ground and a general lack of facilities for children? If so, then this leaflet is for you. Bracknell Forest Borough Council's Countryside Service manages 70 parks and open spaces, 23 play areas and 7.5 kilometres of public rights of way in the Borough. This leaflet gives details of 10 sites that are suitable for children.

### 1. POPE'S MEADOW

The site has a car park and an adjacent children's play area. Adults and children can easily explore Pope's Meadow on foot.

**How to get there:** Pope's Meadow is between Bracknell and Binfield. The site's main entrance is off St. Marks Road, just to the north of its junction with the B3408 London Road.

### 2. LILY HILL PARK

The park forms part of the estate originally belonging to Lily Hill House and consists of parkland, mixed woodland, meadow and formal gardens. The site is famous in the area for its wide variety of trees from all over the world. A picnic area and car park are available and the site also includes some level paths suitable for pushchairs.

**How to get there:** Lily Hill Park is off Lily Hill Road on the north side of the A329 London Road.

### 3. LONGHILL PARK

Longhill Park has wide grassy expanses and level paths. A seasonal pond is home to lots of toads and frogs. The Park has a car park and enclosed children's play area with swings, slides and other equipment.

**How to get there:** Longhill Park is off Longhill Road, north of the junction of the A329 London Road and New Forest Ride.

### 4. SAVERNAKE PARK

Savernake Park's focal point is a large pond, which is particularly popular with local families who come to feed the ducks here. The site is very convenient for the residents of Forest Park and The Warren.

The kick-about area is suitable for ball games and the play area is designed to appeal to children of all ages. There is also a small car park.

**How to get there:** The main entrance to Savernake Park is at the junction of Mendip Road and Savernake Way, off New Forest Ride.

### 5. SOUTH HILL PARK

As well as broad, grassy expanses and several car parks, there are two attractive lakes- North Lake and South Lake - clear lakeside paths, seats and an enclosed children's play area with swings and other equipment.

**How to get there:** South Hill Park is signposted from Bagshot Road, to the south of Bracknell town centre.
