1	<b>Apologies for Absence</b>
2	<p><b>Notes of Previous Meeting</b></p> <p>The notes of the meeting on 17 July 2009 were approved as a correct record subject to paragraph 5 of minute 3 beginning removed.</p> <p><u>Minute 3, Update on Priorities</u></p> <p>Stuart Tarrant would speak to PC Bob Wade regarding obstructive parking outside Lambrook School opposite Grove Lane.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant)</b></p> <p>"It was reported that no further speed enforcement work by the Police was planned for the area in the near future". The Group did not accept this statement and noted the following quote from the Neighbourhood Action Group Chairs meeting on 10 September 2009, '<i>Local neighbourhood specialist officers (NSOs) had access to speed enforcement equipment and with support and guidance from colleagues within the roads policing department locally resourced speed enforcement activities could be undertaken routinely</i>'.</p> <p>It was noted that a speed check date would be arranged when Police officers became available. It was reported that Bracknell Forest Council had facilities to train residents for participation in speed watch but this had already been tried in Chavey Down..</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><b>(Action: NO Lucy Chimerick)</b></p>

	<p>Alan Kendall reported that the double yellow lines on Lovell Road had been implemented.</p> <p>It was reported that there was an increased volume of traffic on Forest Road and this would be discussed with Bracknell Forest Council. <b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant/ Malcolm Young)</b></p> <p>It was noted that the Winkfield, Cranbourne &amp; North Ascot Police Beat Surgeries were experiencing almost no attendance. It was suggested that quarterly surgeries with increased advertising in the local area, rather than monthly surgeries could be more effective. <b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant)</b></p>
3	<p><b>Feedback from NAG Forum</b></p> <p>It was reported that the Police were able to issue on the spot penalty tickets of £50 for littering and that incidents of fly tipping would be investigated.</p> <p>It was reported that heavy rainfall caused the ditch running along Hatchet Lane to fill with sewage. Councillor Kendall would speak to Vincent Palizcka regarding Thames Valley Water's responsibility to address the issue. <b>(Action: Councillor Kendall)</b></p> <p>It was reported that large vehicles were causing obstruction when turning left from Forest Road on to Braziers Lane. This would only be considered a Police issue if an accident was to occur. Stuart Tarrant and Malcolm Young would speak to the Highways Team at Bracknell Forest Council regarding a width and weight restriction for Braziers Lane. <b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant/ Malcolm Young)</b></p>
4	<p><b>Update on Priorities</b></p> <p><u>Speeding</u></p> <p>It was noted that the results of Bracknell Forest Council's Archer Strip Survey for Brockhill and Winkfield Row had not been provided despite repeated requests. The Group agreed that this was unacceptable. Stuart Tarrant would raise this issue with the Vincent Palizcka. <b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant)</b></p> <p><u>Parking</u></p> <p>It was reported that parents were parking on the grass verge when dropping their children off at St Mary's Primary School. The PCSO had requested that a parking attendant visit the site to monitor the situation. Councillor Kendall would speak to Roger Cook regarding possible extension of car parking facilities. Stuart Tarrant would discuss with Winkfield Parish Council. <b>(Action: Councillor Kendall)</b> <b>(Action: Stuart Tarrant)</b></p>

	<p>It was reported that the grass verges at the bottom of Owlsmoor Close were to be restored to prevent parking on the verges and obstruction of the pathway.</p> <p><u>Crime in Fernbank Road</u></p> <p>It was reported that Barkers Meadow was the hotspot for crime on Fernbank Road. Residents were looking in to the possibility of restricting public access to the entrance. It was noted that the reduction of crime in Fernbank Road was a long-term issue for the Police. A brief report would be given at the next NAG meeting.  <b>(Action: Lucy Cimerick)</b></p>
5	<p><b>Neighbourhood Police Team Update</b></p> <p>It was reported that burglaries were on the increase in all northern parishes in the Borough and that operation Ladybird was in place to reduce this. A rise in theft from vehicles was being addressed by an increase in high visibility Police patrols.</p>
6	<p><b>Feedback from Neighbourhood Action Group Chairs' Meeting on 4 November 2009</b></p> <p>It was reported that Winkfield, Cranbourne and North Ascot had the highest attendance of all the Bracknell Forest NAG Forums.</p> <p>It was reported that requests had been made for suitable work for the Community Payback scheme participants to undertake. Community Payback would be launched on 25 January 2010 at Town Hill Barn, Ailsbury.</p> <p>It was suggested that the footpaths on Long Hill Road and near the Royal Berkshire Polo Club could be cleared as both sides of the footpaths were overgrown. David Parkin would follow up. This issue would also be considered in the context of the Parish's litter plans.  <b>(Action: Malcolm Young)</b></p>
7	<p><b>Any Other Business</b></p> <p>There were no other items of business.</p>
8	<p><b>Dates of Future Meetings</b></p> <p>The next meeting of the Winkfield, Cranbourne &amp; North Ascot neighbour Action Group would be arranged for February 2010. Details of the meeting would be circulated once confirmed.</p>
