1. Notes of Previous Meeting

The notes of the previous meeting were agreed as a correct record.

2. Update on Priorities

Speeding

It was confirmed that the Borough Council had approved the installation of two vehicle activated signs on the roads leading towards the Maidens Green crossroads and these would be in place shortly. The practicalities and costs of installing traffic lights at the cross roads was being investigated but the limited availability of publicly owned land would have a significant impact on any decision.

The Police were carrying out regular speed enforcement activities in the area and in the last nine months 280 speeding offences had been dealt with. It was noted that speed enforcement had not been carried out on the B3017 between Don Beni's and the exit of Lambrook Hailey Bury School. It was agreed that the exact locations of enforcement activities would be identified so that the information could be fed back to residents at the Neighbourhood Forum. **Action: Shelly Squires/Julia Winmill**

Archer strips had been installed in Winkfield Row immediately before the entrance to Lambrook Haileybury School on the blind bend. It was noted that because the strips had not been installed where they had originally been requested and the data had been collected over a one week period that included a bank holiday weekend the results were not particularly representative of the scale of the problem however they did show that a high number of vehicles had exceeded the speed limit outside Lambrook Haileybury School and provided a good indication of the times of day when speeding was most prevalent. The reasoning behind the selection of the location of the Archers strips would be ascertained. **Action: Shelly Squires**

The results from the Archers Strips installed in Longhill Road were still outstanding. Comments from the Chavey Down Association on the results of the Archer Strips were still outstanding.

The results of all the Archers Strips exercises would be passed to Winkfield Parish Council who would then follow the matter up with the Borough Council. **Action: Stuart Tarrant**

Lambrook Haileybury School had contacted the Borough Council about the Safer routes to School Scheme and improving road safety in the vicinity of the school and developments would be fed back to the NAG as they occurred.

3. Neighbourhood Consultation

It was reported that the October edition of Town and Country would contain details of the work carried out by NAGs across the Borough as well as a form asking for people to identify their main concerns so that each NAGs' priorities could be refreshed. Winkfield's contribution to the feature would be chased up with Inspector Peter Carter. **Action: Katharine Simpson**

4. Neighbourhood Forum

The Neighbourhood Forum would take place on 7 October 2008 at 7.30pm and would have the same format as the forum in 2007. Stuart Tarrant reported that he would be meeting with Inspector Pete Carter in the first week of September to collate speeding incidents in the area. CADIS data would also be made available so that a full picture of the area could be built up.
