2	Stage 1	Bracknell Methodist Church	The polling at the Church works well. I have never experienced a queue or trouble parking at the site. There always seems to be enough staff and booths to vote in.	The signage for the polling sign is always usually slumped against the front hedge on the ground. Some proper signage on a post would be better so that people can see it as they drive and walk past. That may encourage a bigger turn-out for voting in the area.
3	Stage 1	Crown Wood Community Centre	The existing arrangements are really good, i.e plenty of space, kitchen availability, somewhere quiet to sit for breaks. The community centre has plenty of space and somewhere to sit quietly for breaks, and the use of the kitchen, so no problems there.	The biggest problem at Crown Wood Community Centre is if there is heavy rain, the polling clerks and supervisors spend much time sweeping large puddles of water right outside the front door into the drain to the right of the door. I don't have a suggestion for an alternative arrangement, but perhaps the dip outside the front door could be filled in?
4	Stage 1	Forest Park Community Centre	However, if there is heavy rain the gutters were leaking very badly so much water was walked into the hall which made the whole floor wet. The other issue is there is not good telephone signal there, so the polling supervisor had to stand outside to call the Election Office in the case of an issue. Biased as I live close by but I think it is well situated as people can drop in on their way to or from the station. Also quite a few people use Scotland Hill to visit Tescos etc. Also I presume it is easy to park at the back of the hall.	I don't have a suggestion for an alternative arrangement.

6	Stage 1	North Ascot Community Centre	Spacious, so able to cast vote in private. Manned by very helpful people, always with a smile The Parish Hall has worked extremely well of the past decades and is well know location with easy access (incl. disabled) and short term roadside parking and the BFC car park is adjacent to the hall. With the development of Bucklers Park there will be a need to create a another polling station(The HUB) at some stage when occupancy reaches a "viable" level to justify a second site.	
7	Stage 1	Crowthorne Parish Hall	In the meanwhile, it is suggested that a Polling District for Bucklers Park "CB" is created as part of the existing "CN" area, which will enable a seamless transfer to the second polling site as and when required. Very convenient, including sufficient parking for those who may need to drive. Enough room inside Community Centre for flow of voters, including social distancing if needed.	It has been mentioned by some that the Morgan Centre could replace the Parish Hall. However, notwithstanding the Morgan Centre car park, the hall is more difficult to access, particularly for the disabled, and it is likely drivers will not use the MC car park, but drive up Wellington Road, which is double yellow lined, making roadside parking a significant challenge. There is currently a battle with illegal parking on Wellington Road requiring the insertion of bollards!
