# Important safety information



# Your safety

Please take note of the information on the noticeboards around the building and fire exit doors. These include the steps we have taken to keep the building COVID- safe, safeguarding, e-safety, fire regulations and what to do if you have an accident.



If you have an accident, injury or near miss while on the premises, please speak to a member of staff. We will arrange any necessary help and ask you to complete an incident report form.

Our staff undertake safeguarding training and understand the importance of safeguarding children and adults at risk of abuse. Abuse is when someone does something to another person that damages their quality of life or puts them at risk of harm. The abuse may be physical, emotional, sexual, neglect, financial or discriminatory, organisational, neglect or acts of omission, self-neglect.

If you suspect that a child or adult is being abused or neglected or is at risk, you should contact our **Safeguarding Officer**, based in the office behind main reception or inform your tutor or any member of staff. You can also telephone the Bracknell Forest Adult Safeguarding Team on 01344 351500, the out of hours team on 01344 351999 or Thames Valley Police on 101 (or 999 in an emergency). You can also call these numbers if you are being abused.

**Prevent** is part of the Government's anti-terrorism strategy. It is intended to stop people from being radicalised into violent extremism. In Bracknell Forest, the Prevent Steering Group is chaired by the local



authority and includes the police, health service, education, and the local community.

If you have information regarding suspected terrorist activity, you should report this immediately to the police or Anti-Terrorist Hotline on 0800 789 321. If you believe someone to be vulnerable to radicalisation or at risk of being drawn into radicalisation you should use the safeguarding contacts detailed above.

# Keeping information about you safe

Most of our courses rely on funding from the Education and Skills Funding Agency. In order to claim the funding, we need to collect details about you.



Bracknell Forest Council and the Education and Skills Funding Agency comply with data protection legislation. We will not give your personal details to any organisation for marketing or sales purposes. You can view our Privacy statement at <u>www.bracknell-forest.gov.uk/privacy-notices</u> If you don't already have one, we will use the Learning Records Service to create your Unique Learner Number (ULN) and create your Personal Learning Record. You can access this record throughout your life. Please bring one of the following with you the first time you attend:

- Passport
- Driving licence
- ID card or other form of national identification (e.g., for your place of employment / Bracknell Forest E+ card)
- National Insurance card
- Bank Credit /Debit card
- We will also need to see evidence of any benefits you are receiving. This will help us to make sure you attend your course for free if you are eligible.

# **Taking a qualification**

If you are thinking about taking a qualification course, we will need to check your existing skills level. Sometimes this is called an initial assessment.

We will assess your starting point in English, maths and some IT courses. There will be somebody on hand to assist you. The result will be available to you immediately. You will see your strengths and areas to work on which will help to decide which courses to attend. You will also need to commit to attending regularly and studying hard and will need to sign the learner agreement at the end of this booklet.

### Learner Agreement
