Bracknell Forest Council Housing Service	Domestic Abuse Housing Support Officer – acting as a single point of contact and advocate for victims of domestic abuse to prevent their homelessness and ensure they are provided with appropriate emergency and safe accommodation. Referrals accepted from other council departments (usually Housing Options / Family Safeguarding Model)  Sanctuary Scheme: a multi-agency victim centred initiative which aims to make it possible for victims of domestic abuse to remain in their own homes, where it is safe to do so, where it is their choice, and where the perpetrator does not live in the accommodation. This is done by providing additional security to the victim's property, delivered in partnership with Safe Partnership Limited. The scheme is available to anyone at risk or threat of domestic abuse, in Bracknell Forest, regardless of tenure including housing association tenants, private rented sector tenants and oner occupiers. Choices Groupwork programme: 6-week group programme that supports survivors to explore abusive relationships, recognise early warning signs and the impact of abuse on children. 	offending. It has two elements: 'Right to Ask' and 'Right to Know'.  'Right to Ask' allows for a member of the public the right to ask the police if their partner may pose a risk to them (a third party such a friend, family member or professional can also ask). If records show a risk, the police will consider disclosing this information. 'Right to Know' enables police to pro-actively make a disclosure if they receive information about the violent or abusive behaviour of a person that may impact on someone's safety.

MARAC – Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conference	Monthly multi-agency meeting for practitioners/agencies to discuss high risk domestic abuse cases. Any partner agency can refer a case to the MARAC via the agency's Designated MARAC Officer (DMO) and online system Modus. Victims First Hub	Acting as a 'one front door' to all services in Thames Valley to ensure victims can get the support they need to cope and recover. Providing free, confidential, non-discriminatory emotional and practical support to all victims and in some instances their family members in accordance with their needs and the harm caused by the crime. Victims First has a number of specialist services which includes help for victims of sexual violence and domestic abuse. They may refer into one of the specialist services which include:  - Victims First Emotional Support Service (VFESS): providing emotional support, advocacy, practical help and information for those affected by crime including those who have been indirectly affected.  - Victims First Specialist Support (VFSS): helping victims recover from the experience of serious crime such as rape, sexual abuse, exploitation and modern slavery.  - Victims First Counselling Service: available to victims of crime who are being supported by a support service.
