The service is client led and includes the following: Listening with understanding and compassion; ensuring the voice of family members affected by fatal domestic abuse is heard; provision of specialist and expert Advocates; use of expertise to advocate for families during domestic homicide reviews, Inquests, serious case reviews, mental health reviews, and similar inquiries; peer support - bringing together of families to share their story.

Providing advocacy, support and consultancy for victims of domestic abuse in the Thames Valley experiencing domestic abuse, sexual violence and stalking. Clients are not required to report to the police in order to access support.

Providing support to families affected by domestic abuse.

Commissioned domestic abuse service for Bracknell Forest, supporting all genders. Self and agency referrals accepted. Providing: refuge accommodation for women and their children and able to support men to find other refuge accommodation out of area; Outreach and IDVA (Independent Domestic Violence Advcate) service, including a specialist Diverse Communities worker; helpline and groupwork (Choices - currently on hold, and peer group support open to anyone who has already been supported by one of BWA's existing services).

Local authority.

Website with a number of public health resources and support services.

Co-ordinating the work of local organisations and supporting members of the community in order that they can safeguard vulnerable people living in the borough.

A free mobile app, launched in partnership with the Vodafone Foundation, providing support and information to anyone who may be in an abusive relationship or those concerned about someone they know.

Also designed to be used by specialist and non-specialist practitioners and other employers, and for anyone looking for information about issues around domestic abuse such as online safety, stalking and harassment and sexual consent.

Self-referrals and professional referrals are welcome. For adults aged 18 years old and over who have experienced any form of domestic abuse, sexual abuse or exploitation at any point in their lives. Providing up to 18 free counselling sessions in a safe, confidential space to explore experiences of abuse and any underlying issues. Counselling sessions are offered remotely via telephone or online using the Zoom platform.

Lifeline (formerly Paws Protect) is Cats Protection's specialist cat fostering service for those fleeing domestic abuse. Offering a free and confidential fostering service for cats whose families are fleeing domestic abuse so they can rest assured their cat will be taken care of until they can be safely returned. Referrals (self and agency) are handled by a specialist and experienced team, who support owners referring to the service, arrange to collect cats, and organise foster placements through a wonderful network of dedicated Lifeline volunteers.

CURRENTLY ON HOLD A 6 week group programme for women affected by domestic abuse. Adapted and developed by BWA from the Freedom programme, delivered by experienced BWA domestic abuse workers and is available to all service users, regardless of their circumstances and the risk level they are at due to domestic abuse.

Charity helping people to resolve their legal, money and other problems by providing free, independent and confidential advice.

Run by the Family Safeguarding Model team, a group for anyone needing some advice and/or emotional support around domestic abuse, part of present. Relaxed group offering a coffee and a chat, great for signposting to DA groups, legal advice, housing/benefits advice etc. Runs every Friday morning (all year), children welcome.

National risk identification checklist.

Home Office campaign to help young people understand what a healthy relationship is.

Offering pet fostering services specifically for dogs belonging to people accessing refuge or emergency housing.

10 week group work programme for mothers and children (aged 7 to 14) who have experienced domestic abuse. The aim is to talk to each other about the abuse, learn to communicate and rebuild and strengthen their relationship in a creative and safe environment. Referrals through online form (see website listed).

The DVDS (also known as Clare's Law) enables the police to disclose information to a person at risk of domestic abuse about their current or new partner's previous abusive of violent offending. It has two elements: 'Right to Ask' and 'Right to Know'.

'Right to Ask' allows for a member of the public the right to ask the police if their partner may pose a risk to them (a third party such a friend, family member or professional can also ask). If records show a risk, the police will consider disclosing this information. 'Right to Know' enables police to pro-actively make a disclosure if they receive information about the violent or abusive behaviour of a person that may impact on someone's safety.

Registered charity specialising in arranging Non-Molestation Orders, Prohibited Steps Orders and Occupation Orders.

A growing network of large and small businesses with a mission to enable employers to take action on domestic abuse – raising awareness among all employees, supporting those affected, and providing support and education to help perpetrators to stop. Includes a toolkit for employers.

Two full time Victim Caseworkers (Co-ordinator and caseworker). Working with victims of domestic abuse (longer term social care cases), helping them to recognise abuse and support them to make changes to protect their children and themselves.

One full time 1:1 Perpetrator Caseworker (longer-term cases with CIN, CP or issuing care proceedings).

Helping people experiencing domestic abuse or violence from their partners, ex-partners or family members to access specialist advice and support. Offering a free legal advice appointment (telephone or face to face) with a volunteer solicitor, legal executive or barrister who specialises in Family Law.

A joint Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office and Home Office Unit which leads on the government's forced Marriage policy, outreach and casework. Operating a public helpline to provide advice and support to victims and potential victims of forced marriage and professionals dealing with cases. Information and practice guidelines for professionals online.

App developed by the Hollie Gazzard Trust. In danger? With a simple shake or tap it activates Hollie Guard, immediately notifying your chosen contacts, pinpointing your location and sending audio and video evidence directly to their mobile phones.

Government guidance and advice on domestic abuse - find out how to get help if you or someone you know is a victim of domestic abuse. Information available in different languages including Welsh, Spanish, French, Italian, Polish, Romanian, Somalian, Chinese, Arabic and more.

Providing information and support to an older person or anyone concerned about an older person who is at risk of, experiencing or recovering from any form of abuse or neglect.

A small, local charity helping to support other charities and community groups throughout Bracknell Forest, Wokingham Borough and the surrounding areas.

In partnership with the Japanese Embassy in London, offering outreach advice in Japanese to Japanese survivors of domestic abuse who need help and support around domestic abuse, family law, housing etc.

The only specialist organisation in the UK supporting Jewish women and children affected by domestic abuse and sexual violence.

Survivor led support for adult and child victims of domestic abuse providing a support network, 'Liberation from Abuse' programme (6 weeks), 'Fun with Mum', education, training and prevention programmes.

Supporting all those affected by Honour Based Abuse. Running the national Honour Based Abuse helpline.

A free, confidential online support and counselling service for young people aged 11-19 years old.

Life is a UK pregnant support charity. There is a network of supported housing properties across the UK, run in partnerships with local authorities which support some of the most disadvantaged women, babies, children and young people. The Bracknell Life house is a 7 bed property for women who are 16-25 years old which presents as shared accommodation. Each property has an assigned Support Worker who will work with the client to achieve positive outcomes which includes healthy relationship work.

A website aimed at teens and young adults that explains what relationship abuse is and offers support.

Support for Trans and Non-Binary victims of domestic abuse or sexual violence and offers emergency temporary accommodation (first ever national refuge) for those fleeing domestic abuse.

Confidential helpline for male victims of domestic abuse across the UK as well as their friends, family, neighbours, work colleagues and employers.

Monthly multi-agency meeting for practitioners/agencies to discuss high risk domestic abuse cases. Any partner agency can refer a case to the MARAC via the agency's Designated MARAC Officer (DMO) and online system Modus.

Single Point of Contact for all safeguarding concerns about children and young people living in Bracknell. The MASH brings together a team of professionals from a number of partner agencies to deal with safeguarding concerns for a child or young person.

Monthly multi-agency domestic abuse perpetrator focused process. It identifies the most harmful perpetrators, either by using police resources or by referral from external agencies and aims to: change offender behaviour; reduce reoffending of the most harmful and serial perpetrators; and safeguard victims and families.

National confidential helpline for male victims of domestic abuse and those supporting them.

Information on services in the area that can help children and young people, and adults experiencing mental health problems.

A free, fast emergency injunction service to survivors of domestic abuse and violence regardless of their financial circumstances, race, gender or sexual orientation.

Run by the Suzy Lamplugh Trust, advice and support for anyone being stalked and harassed.

Bracknell Forest's Drug and Alcohol Action Team (DAAT) are committed to making sure that anyone who lives in Bracknell Forest with either a drink or drug problem can access help and support. The DAAT is both a commissioner and provider of services.

Information and support for clients with no recourse to public funds. Providing options and pathways.

Help for adults concerned about a child.

OPOKA aims to help women and children in the Polish community improve health, well-being, financial stability, and happiness by stopping domestic violence and abuse. Offering practical and emotional support, safe accommodation, counselling and therapeutic programmes for women and children.

A trauma-informed service established to assist high risk victims of stalking in England and Wales.

A free one-to-one therapeutic intervention for men and women who recognise that their behaviour in their relationship is becoming or has become problematic and need support to make positive, healthy and long term change.

Rape Crisis Centres provide specialist support and services to women and girls who have experienced sexual violence. Centres in the Thames Valley are Sexual Assault and Abuse Support Service Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes or Oxfordshire Sexual Abuse and Rape Crisis Centre (OSARCC). The Rape Crisis National Helpline offers free, confidential emotional support and information.

A women's charity working to help women through the law with a focus on addressing violence against women.

A specialist sexual violence and abuse charity led by the needs of its clients.

Building Respectful Families (BRF): a service for families affected by Child to Parent Violence (CPV) where young people are aged 8 to 18 years old.

Thames Valley Children and Young People Support After Crime Service: see individual entry below.

Safe Spaces are available in pharmacies across the UK (Boots, Morrisons pharmacies, Superdrug pharmacies, Well pharmacies, independent pharmacies) as well as HSBC and TSB banks. Once inside, all the specialist domestic abuse support information will be available to access. Some Safe Spaces are also prepared to respond to the Ask for ANI codeword, to provide victims with a discreet way to access help calling the police on 999 or specialist support services.

Specially trained volunteers listen and help anyone that calls to talk through their concerns, worries and troubles. Phone or email. Also see the website for the self-help app and for tips on what to do if you're worried about someone else.

Scheme to provide additional security in the homes of victims of domestic abuse from Bracknell Forest, allowing them to remain in their homes. Referrals are via Berkshire Women's Aid, Bracknell Forest Council or Thames Valley Police and installation carried out by Safe Partnership.

The only domestic abuse service that specialises in supporting Deaf young people and adults. Delivering prevention workshops as well as closed groups for Deaf survivors. Online referral form.

Based in Slough (Upton Court Hospital) and Bicester (Police House), the SARC (Sexual Assault Referral Centre) provide a service to men, women and children who have experienced rape or sexual assault. Also providing advice and online services for professionals.

Military staff and families face some unique challenges, our team provides comprehensive and confidential support, with a special focus on services for adults, but including children, young people and their families.

An easy read website for people with learning disabilities and autism living in the Thames Valley. Designed to provide information and guidance on staying safe whilst at home, and out and about in the community covering a range of topics such as healthy relationships, exploitation and grooming, online safety and hate crime. To keep the website interesting there are also quizzes, videos and games all designed to keep people safe. The website is split into two sections, one which is completely easy read and the other is a resources toolkit for parents, carers and professionals.

The website was designed by Buckinghamshire Council in partnership with Talkback. Talkback is a local charity that supports people aged 16 or older with a learning disability and or autism. Focus groups from Talkback were used to test and choose all aspects of the website down to the name and the colour palette.

A registered charity raising awareness of economic abuse with a mission to transform responses to it. Not offering direct support or advice, however for financial support tailored to victim-survivors of economic abuse, see the Financial Support Line (see below) run in partnership with Money Advice Plus.

The Banking Support Directory is an important new information tool that can help make it easier for survivors to get help. It brings together information about the ways in which the UK's major banks and building societies can support victim-survivors to regain control of their finances, including de-linking from the abuser.

Services include SIGNAL 4 Carers - support and information service for people who look after other people.

Providing short term advice and guidance to victim-survivors of domestic abuse. The aim of the service is to increase the economic safety for the victim-survivor.

Website to help children and young people to understand domestic abuse, and how to take positive action if it's happening to them.

The UK's leading support service for young people under 25 years old. Offering a confidential helpline and counselling service.

Providing confidential information, advice and support for people who have experienced rape and childhood sexual abuse.

Information and support for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller women. Includes information on legal rights, options and local available support as well as a Healthy Relationships Toolkit for young people and information for practitioners.

Free confidential support to anyone affected by sexual assault in the Thames Valley.

10 week group programme, delivered virtually, for women aged 16+ who have been, or are currently, victims of domestic abuse. Suitable for those who are not high risk, and is available in the following languages: English, Welsh, Urdu, Bengali, Polish and Gujarati. The programme looks at the importance of self-worth, self-care and mindfulness.

Acting as a 'one front door' to all services in Thames Valley to ensure victims of crime can get the support they need to cope and recover from the impact of their crime. Providing free, confidential, nondiscriminatory emotional and practical support to all victims and witnesses of crime as well as family members of victims, in accordance with their needs and the harm caused by the crime. Victims First may refer into one of their specialist core services including: Victims First Thames Valley Sexual Violence Service, Victims First Thames Valley Adults Specialist Service, Victims First Thames Valley Children and Young People Support After Crime Service.

Delivered by Victim Support, offering a service to support victims of all crime types (excluding sexual offences), and also has a particular focus on standard risk domestic abuse. For victims and witnesses of crime aged 18+ who reside or study in the Thames Valley.

NO Referrals are via the Victims First Hub who will contact the victim or witness, make an assessment of their needs and then refer them to the most appropriate source of support, which may be the Thames Valley Adult Victims Service.

Different interventions will be offered to different victims according to their needs. Some interventions available are: group work sessions (including topics such as impact of crime, understanding the CJS, moving forward from crime and understanding domestic abuse; peer support sessions; IDVA support; one to one support.

Delivered by Safe! providing support to children and young people aged 5 up to 18 years old who have been a victim or witness of crime and who reside or study in the Thames Valley. Parents and carers can also receive support.

Referrals are via the Victims First Hub who will contact the parent/carer of the victim or witness (unless no consent to contact parent/carer), make an assessment of their needs and then refer them to the most appropriate source of support, which may be the Thames Valley Children and Young People Support After Crime Service.

Different interventions will be offered to different victims according to their needs. Some types of interventions available are: group work programmes (including PAACE Recovery Toolkit and DAY, both for CYP impacted by domestic abuse; parent support including peer support and groups; themed wellbeing group sessions, trips and activities; one to one support; therapeutic provision; CHIDVA and CHISVA support; digital support - text support service, online drop-ins, themed webinars.

Delivered by Hope After Harm (formerly Thames Valley Partnership), offering a safe and confidential space for victims or witnesses of sexual offences aged 18+ who reside or study in the Thames Valley.

Self and agency referrals are via the Victims First Hub who will contact the victim or witness, make an assessment of their needs and then refer them to the most appropriate source of support, which may be the Thames Valley Sexual Violence Service.

Providing specialist one to one support, information and advice to those going through the criminal justice system, advocacy and can also help with onward referrals to other beneficial services. Also providing informal and structured group work to those using the service.

Who's In Charge is an 8 week programme for parents or carers of young people (age 10-18) who are struggling to manage behaviours that seem beyond control.
