### Foundations – Update on REACH plan and pilot evaluations

Foundations have shared an [update on their five-year REACH Plan](#), which aims to close the evidence gap on effective approaches to support babies, children, and young people affected by domestic abuse. This includes findings from two pilot evaluations, one of which is the [Bounce Back 4 Kids \(BB4K\)](#), run by PACT in Reading, West Berkshire and Wokingham. The next stage for BB4K is likely to be launched in April 2026 (with mobilisation from January 2026) resulting in the service being expanded across Oxfordshire. This work, delivered over 3 years, will result in c500 families being supported through the programme.
