DEFINITIONS

----- Footpath

A highway over which the public have a right of way on foot only.

+ + + + + Bridleway

A highway over which the public have a right of way on foot, on horseback and leading a horse and pedal cycles (including mountain bikes).

- - - - - Restricted Byway

A highway over which the public is entitled to travel on foot, horseback and with non-mechanically propelled vehicles (such as pedal cycles and horsedrawn vehicles).

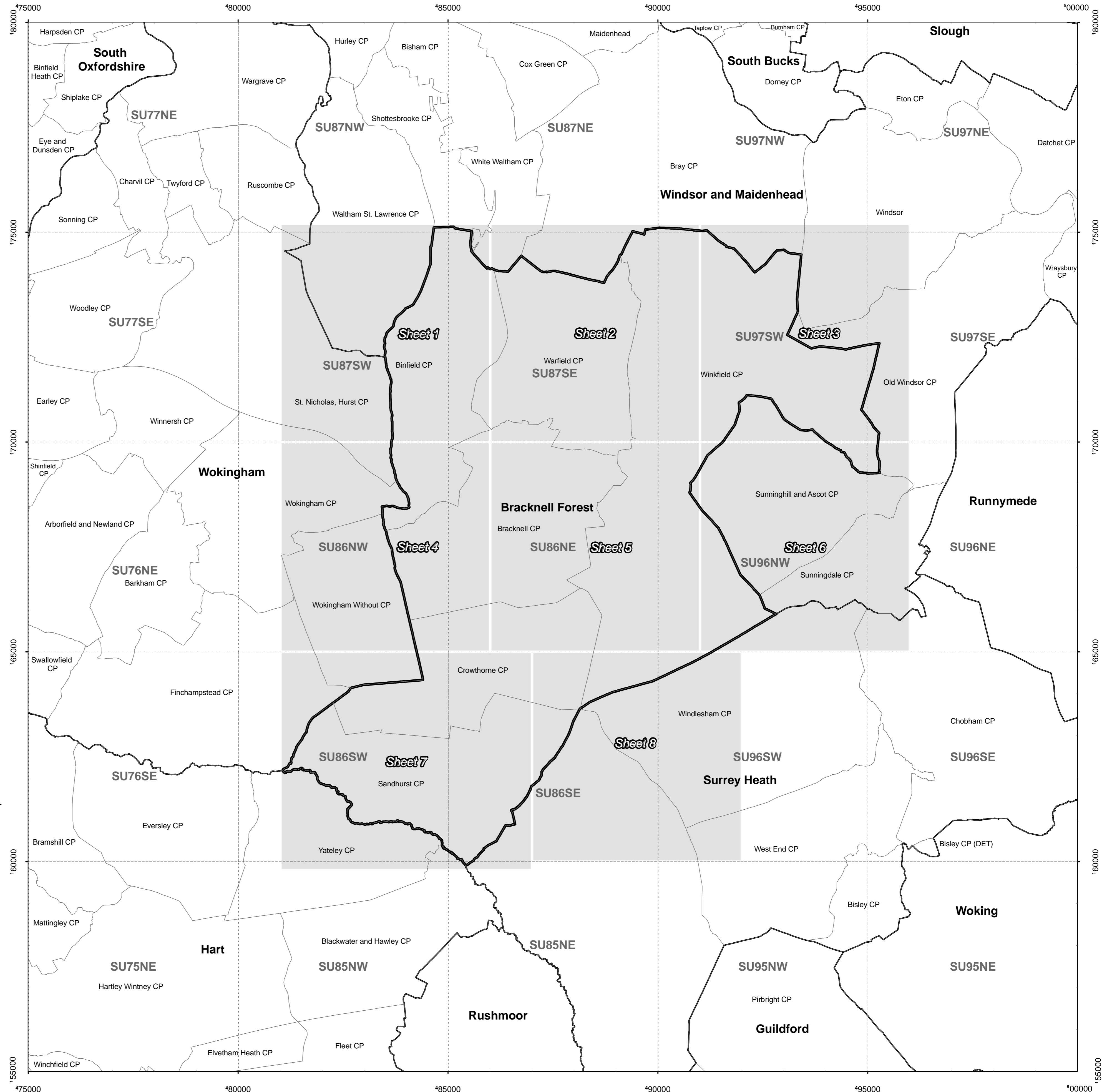
v v v v v Byway Open to All Traffic

A highway over which the public have a right of way for vehicular and all other kinds of traffic (unless restricted by a Traffic Regulation Order) but which is used by the public mainly for the purposes for which footpaths and bridleways are used, i.e. walking, cycling or horse riding.
